Achievement & Aspirations

Driven by a clear vision, we are determined to provide our children with excellent opportunities to learn the core subjects of reading, writing, mathematics and science. We offer a broad and balanced curriculum and provide meaningful experiences that ignite curiosity and enthusiasm for learning. All the subjects in the primary curriculum, including humanities, the arts, modern foreign languages, ICT and PE are equally embedded into our provision.

The gifted singing at St Michael's provides the children, teachers and parents/carers with immense joy.

To bring their learning to life, our children participate in regular trips, ranging from local museums to theatres in London's west-end.

A residential trip at the beginning of Year 6 enables children to build those important bonds between classmates and encourages self-esteem, independence and teamwork.

Our location also enables the children to regularly visit Mayow Park, only a five-minute walk away, promoting a sense of well-being and an appreciation of nature.

We also use local grounds for forest school activities.

Early Years

We know how important the early years are for sowing the seeds of learning.

The activities and experiences offered at St Michael's are designed to enhance the all-round development of the children and support their physical, emotional, intellectual and social development.

In our Nursery and Reception classes, children will learn through active and investigative play, both inside and out. We will provide exciting and stimulating opportunities for children to explore and develop learning experiences, which help them to make sense of the world.

We pride ourselves on being a caring community, reflected beautifully in our successful buddy system. This feature of St Michael's exemplifies the values of kindness, love and compassion.

Every year we hold a buddy service, where each Reception child is paired with a Year 6 student who makes a pledge to look after and take care of them. Throughout the year, time is allocated for the children to spend time together, developing those precious bonds.

Clubs & Sport

Our aim is to ensure that children also have a wide range of opportunities outside of the classroom, which are safe, fun and healthy and enrich our children's lives. We believe that sport has many benefits for children – it improves fitness, well-being and learning, as well as increases the likelihood that they will become active adults.

We offer a variety of activities, during and after-school, including football, cricket, basketball, athletics, gymnastics and swimming.

We have a range of after-school activity clubs including art and baking clubs – all run by St. Michael's staff.

Wrap-Around Care

Breakfast Club

We offer a breakfast club, which is a fun, relaxing start to the day for children whose parents need childcare from 7.30am. Supervised by school staff in our school hall, this popular club provides a great chance for children to begin their day in a familiar environment with lots of activities to keep them entertained.

After School Provision

We also offer an after-school provision on site, again run by school staff. It provides high quality childcare from after school until 6pm. For parents, this means knowing that your child is safe and happy in a club that is reliable and offers a consistent service. For the child, this means an environment that is safe, supportive and encouraging. It is a place to be with friends and make new ones; to be able to try out new activities, to relax, to have fun and enjoy.

Admissions

We aim to be inclusive and (from the September 2022 intake) no preference is given to children who regularly attend church.

Applications for a Reception place are co-ordinated through Lewisham Local Authority and should be made online.

To apply for a place in Years 1-6 or the existing Reception class (i.e. a transfer from another school) an on-line application is required via the Parent Portal on Lewisham Council's website.
